Check list of requirements of the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS)

When providing access to Conditional registration under the Classic Vehicle Scheme CMC CVS Administrator relies on Clubs to know their members and their vehicles. Clubs must require owners to notify them of modifications made to their vehicles. When Clubs stamp the 1835 declaration for registration or renewal of a vehicle under the CVS they must ensure that these requirements are met and all the appropriate documents are supplied to CMC CVS administrator.

Please provide this completed form with all relevant documents to CMC CVS administrator. If the complete set of documents are not received, the paperwork won't be processed.

All appropriate check boxes must be ticked to show that relevant requirements of the CVS scheme have been met.

- The owner** is a financial member of the nominated Primary Club. (The owner is referred to as the Registered Operator once the vehicle is registered.)
- The Primary Club** is affiliated with Council of Motor Clubs Inc.
- The vehicle** is 30 years old or more, calculated from the month of build (if known).
- The vehicle** is less than 3.5 tonne Gross Vehicle Mass (GVM).
- The vehicle** is normally garaged in NSW.
- The CVS declaration form No.1835** is complete and should be less than 42 days old when presented to Service NSW for registration purposes. (Original document required by CMC CVS and SNSW).
- At initial registration on CVS the declaration is accompanied by a blue slip less than 42 days old complete with identification and design checks. (Copy required by CMC CVS).
- At renewals the declaration is accompanied by a safety inspection report (pink slip) less than 6-months old. (Copy required by CMC CVS).
- Engineering Certification (ECS or VSCCS)** is provided when necessary (the No. of this is required by CMC CVS and by SNSW). Refer to VSI-6 to clarify.

If further modifications are made to a vehicle the owner must notify the Club. A further blue slip may be needed and a further VSCCS certification. In that case, copies of both updated documents must be supplied to CMC CVS.

The owner, vehicle and documents meet the requirements of the Classic Vehicle Scheme.
